ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. Sub. 911/51.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act a water board shall have power to construct water works for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is provided by section 41 of the said Act (as amended by the Water Boards Act Amendment Act, 1937) that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operation of certain sections of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the reticulation works referred to in the following Schedule shall be exempt from the operations of the said sections of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him, doth hereby exempt from the operations of sections 41, 42, 43, 44 and 45 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, the reticulation works included in the following Schedule.

Extension of water mains by laying 4in., 2in. and 1in. water mains within the Albany Water Area in Albany Highway, Katoomba Street and Minor Road, together with all necessary valves, hydrants and services as shown on Plan P.W.D., 33716.

Amendment to By-laws—Brunswick Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 248/39, Ex. Co. No. 756.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 141 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, that a water board may make by-laws relating to the administration of the Act; and whereas the Governor in Council, by an Order dated 18th April, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th July, 1939, did approve of by-laws for the Brunswick Water Area; and whereas it is now desired to amend such by-laws: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby directs that the said by-laws shall be amended in the manner stated in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

The abovementioned by-laws are amended as follows:—

1. By deleting by-law 90 and substituting in lieu thereof the following:—

Building Fees.

Where water is required for building purposes, the Minister may permit the supply thereof at prices as set forth in Schedule I hereto, and on the following terms:—

- All fees shall be paid in advance. If any work is done other than that mentioned at the time of applying to the Minister, the same shall be paid for in advance, or the whole supply will forthwith be cut off.
- It shall be at the discretion of the Minister as to whether or not in any case a supply of water shall be classed as a supply for building purposes, and as to whether or not the supply shall be measured by meter.
- Applications for water under this by-law shall be in writing, stating the nature of the work to be done and the purpose for which water is required.

Repairs to Houses.

35 (A).—The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathrooms, lavatories attached to or used in connection therewith in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and in particular shall:

1. Repair or replace any roof or part thereof which shall become in disrepair;

2. repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp;
3. replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein;
4. repair and replace with new material where necessary any verandah or the roof, floor supports or other parts thereof which may become in disrepair;
5. repair and replace where necessary any steps or hand-rails thereof which may become in disrepair;
6. repair or replace any flashings which may become in disrepair;
7. replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair;
8. repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or missing;
9. keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks;
10. replace or repair all skirtings, architraves and fixtures, which may become a harbourage for vermin;
11. keep all walls, ceilings and the plaster and the wall paper thereon in good repair, and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wall paper which may become dilapidated or in disrepair;
12. refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease to fit properly;
13. repair or replace with new, any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and reglaze any windows which may become broken or cracked;
14. keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act and Regulations and By-laws made hereunder;
15. keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the requirements of the Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A.;
16. retain all natural lighting free from any obstruction which would reduce the natural lighting below the ratio of one square foot of lighting to each 10 square feet of floor area.

Repairs to Outhouses.

35 (B). The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain all out-buildings attached to or used in connection with such house in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and all of the provisions of the preceding by-law relating to houses used for human habitation shall, so far as applicable apply in like manner as if the same had been set out in detail of this By-law.

by the Court of Arbitration and in pursuance of the powers contained in section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, I hereby order and declare that Award No. 31 of 1948, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the manner following:—

Clause 25—Preference to Unionists.

Delete this clause and substitute in lieu thereof the following:—

Clause 25—Preference to Unionists.

(a) In this clause the term "unionist" means a worker who is a member of the applicant Union, and the term "non-unionist" means a worker who is not a member of the applicant Union.

(b) Unionists shall be given preference of employment and, if the Commission employs a non-unionist, it commits a breach of this Award if during such employment there are unionists competent to do the work and available and ready to perform it.

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (b) hereof, it shall not be a breach of this clause for the Commission to employ a non-unionist if the latter, within either 14 days of the date of this Order, or within 14 days of the commencement of his employment, makes application to join the Union and thereafter, if accepted, completes such application.

(d) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to cancel or amend this clause at any time during the currency of this Award.

(e) If during the continuance of this Award the Union, or the majority of the members of the Union, shall be concerned in or take part in anything in the nature of a strike, the benefit of this clause shall *ipso facto* cease and determine.

(f) If any employment subsist or continue to subsist in breach of this clause, both the employer and the worker concerned shall be liable to a penalty for the breach.

(g) The foregoing provisions shall not apply to the following:—

- (i) Juniors or apprentices.
- (ii) Workers covered by any Award or Industrial Agreement between the State Executive, Australasian Society of Engineers, Industrial Association of Workers and the Western Australian Government Railways Commission.
- (iii) Carpenters and or car and wagon builders who, pursuant to the decision of Mr. President Dunphy, dated 21st April, 1949 (29 W.A.I.G., p. 137), have maintained their membership of unions other than the Union party to this Award.
- (iv) Tradesmen employed in a temporary capacity.
