WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1953 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Municipality of Albany has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been used for a street or way within the Municipality of Albany, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 22nd day of September, 1954, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Water Boards Act, 1904-1951.

Geraldton Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 367/18.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to alter or extend the boundaries of a Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Geraldton Water Area to comprise all that land as defined in the Schedule hereto.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 22nd day of September, 1954.

Schedule.

Part I.—All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and the prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of Victoria Location 2114 and extending Easterly to and along that boundary to the South-Western side of the North-West Coastal Highway (road No. 1977); thence South-Easterly along that side to a point in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of location 1712; thence Easterly along that prolongation to the Eastern side of the Geraldton-Northampton Railway Reserve; thence generally Southerly along that side to the Southern boundary of location 1712 aforesaid; thence Easterly along that boundary to the North-Western corner of location 2276; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of that location, the Westernmost boundary of location 1954 and the prolongation Southerly of the latter to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Northernmost boundary of location 2048; thence Westerly and Southerly to and along the Northernmost and Western boundaries of that location and onwards to the Northern boundary of location 1956; thence Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of locations 1956 and 8987 (reserve 20193) and onwards to the Northern boundary of location 2185; thence Easterly, Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly, again Westerly, again Southerly, again Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of that location to the

South-Eastern corner of location 8982 (reserve 19984); thence Westerly, South-Westerly and again Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 8982, 8071, 673 and 8056 to the Eastern boundary of reserve 21856; thence Southerly along that boundary to the Northern boundary of location 4940; thence Westerly along the Northern boundaries of locations 4940, 181 and 6848 to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean, and thence generally North-Westerly and generally North-Easterly along that low water mark to the starting point, as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34319.

Part II.—All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the North-Westernmost corner of Victoria Location 9726 (reserve 17711) and extending generally Easterly along the Northern boundaries of locations 9726, 9680 and 7019 (reserve 17777) to the Western boundary of location 2725; thence Northerly, Easterly, generally South-Easterly, Southerly, again Easterly and generally South-Westerly along boundaries of locations 2725 and 3119 to the South-Eastern corner of the latter location; thence Westerly, Northerly and South-Westerly along boundaries of locations 3119, 7019 (reserve 17777) aforesaid and 2251 to the latter's Western corner, and thence Southerly, Westerly, Northerly, again Westerly and again Northerly along boundaries of location 9726 (reserve 17711) aforesaid to the starting point, as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., No. 34319.

Part III.—All that portion of land, being a strip of land 50 links wide, the centre line of which is a pipe line starting at a point on the Westernmost boundary of Victoria Location 9726 (reserve 17711) situate about 46 chains 50 links Southerly from the North-Eastern corner of location 3191 and extending 270 degrees 29 minutes about 46 chains, thence 263 degrees 36 minutes 294 chains 47 links; thence 249 degrees 38 minutes 100 chains 59 links; thence 260 degrees 13 minutes 271 chains 67 links; thence 272 degrees 7 minutes 95 chains 95 links, and thence 330 degrees 40 minutes to the North-Western side of road No. 353, as shown coloured red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34319.

Part IV.—All that portion of road No. 353 starting from the lastmentioned intersections, as described in Part III, and extending generally Westerly along the whole of that road to an Eastern boundary of Part I, including Victoria Location 9711 (reserve 22230), as shown coloured red on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 34319.
