P R E F A C E .

"Sat cito, si sat bene."

USE alone will appraise the merits and shortcomings of the following Historical Table and Index.

The Instructions given were simply "to make an Alphabetical Index;" but, in order to do this satisfactorily, a Text had first to be constructed. Accordingly I perused the whole body of the Statutes, eliminating everything which had ceased to be law, recasting the existing Table, and carrying it to date. I then went through each Statute in the bound-up Edition to the end of 1882, and in the Annual Volumes after that date, making the Index Entries as I went along. The greatest care has been taken in endeavoring to word the Headings in the shape most likely to meet the requirements of those who may consult the Index, and Imperial Statutes are cited in many instances, recourse having been had to the Volumes in the Law Library. In the case of Local Enactments of paramount importance a Digest has now and then been attempted, more particularly where it is believed that fresh Legislation is contemplated. Cross References have been for the most part avoided. Every written Entry has been twice compared and checked, in the view of minimising error, and the printed Proofs have been as often revised. It is hoped that by these precautions future compilers of an Index may be saved the labor of spelling through voluminous early Legislation, and enabled to use this Index as their Text to work upon, thus rendering the task an easy one.

For the choice of Type and general Arrangement I am responsible; the execution of the Printed Matter speaks for itself.

If the Bench, or the Legal Profession, the Legislature, the Magistracy, the Civil Service, or the Mercantile Community should derive any little assistance from consulting the ensuing pages, the compiler will have been amply rewarded for a labor extending over a period of nearly two years.
