These regulations may be cited as the *Referendums Regulations 1984*¹.

3. Argument under s. 9, length of

An argument forwarded to the Electoral Commissioner under section 9(1) or (3) of the *Referendums Act 1983* shall consist of not more than 2 000 words.

The writ for a referendum shall be in the form of Form 1 in Schedule 1.
