### AN ACT to amend section fifteen of the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1954.

[Assented to 28th November, 1955.]

**BE** it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1955*. Short title and citation.

(2) In this Act the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1954,

is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Constitution Acts Amendment Act, 1899-1955.

2. Section fifteen of the principal Act is amended by—

- (a) deleting the word “Australia” in line one of paragraph (i) of the second proviso;
  - (b) inserting after paragraph (i) of the second proviso a paragraph as follows—
    - (ii) no person who is a native according to the interpretation of that expression in section two of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, and is not the holder of a certificate of citizenship pursuant to the provisions of the Natives (Citizenship Rights) Act, 1944-1951, shall be entitled to be registered as an elector;
  - (c) deleting the paragraph designation “(ii)” where it appears immediately after paragraph (i) of the second proviso and substituting therefor the paragraph designation “(iii)”;
  - (d) deleting all the words after the word “Commonwealth” in line five of the last paragraph of the section down to the end of such paragraph.
