AN ACT to amend the Road Districts Act, 1919-1954

[Assented to 4th January, 1957.]

BE it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

and citation.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *Road Districts Act Amendment Act, 1956*.

(2) In this Act the Road Districts Act, 1919-1954, Act No. 38 of 1919 as reprinted with amendments to and including Act No. 25 of 1948 incorporated pursuant to the provisions of the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, and further amended by Acts Nos. 15 of 1950, 41 of 1951 and 73 of 1954, is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Road Districts Act, 1919-1956.

2. Section one hundred and sixty of the principal Act is amended by adding after paragraph (34) the following paragraph:—

(35) undertake the control and management of an acclimatisation district proclaimed under the provisions of Part IIIA. of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, in respect of which the board is registered as a trout acclimatisation society under such Act, and apply its revenue to the purposes of such control and management, and delegate its powers, authorities and functions in respect of any such acclimatisation district to a committee of its members.

3. Section two hundred and one of the principal Act is amended by adding after subparagraph (iii) of paragraph (60) the following subparagraph:—

(iv) for all or any purposes for which a trout acclimatisation society may make by-laws pursuant to subsection (8) of section thirty-one of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1956, relating to the control and management of acclimatisation districts proclaimed under the provisions of Part IIIA. of that Act.
