AN ACT to amend the Stamp Act, 1921-1952.

[Assented to 25th August, 1954.]

BE it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *Stamp Act Amendment Act, 1954*. Short title and citation.

(2) In this Act the Stamp Act, 1921-1952, Act No. 10 of 1922 as reprinted pursuant to the provisions of the Amendments Incorporation Act, 1938, with amendments to and including Act No. 11 of 1950, and further amended by Act No. 48 of 1952, Reprinted Acts, Vol. 5, 1952. Approved for reprint 3rd April, 1950.

is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Stamp Act, 1921-1954.

2. The principal Act is amended by repealing— Heading to sections 102 and 103 and the sections repealed.

(a) the heading "Admissions of Practitioners in Supreme Court" immediately preceding section one hundred and two;

(b) sections one hundred and two and one hundred and three.

3. The Second Schedule to the principal Act is amended by deleting all the words and figures in the first item, namely—

“The person admitted. ADMISSION of any person as a Practitioner of the Supreme Court (see sections 102 and 103) 10 0 0.”
