

THE BANK HOLIDAYS.

AN ACT to amend The Bank Holidays Act, 1884.

[Assented to 7th January, 1949.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as *The Bank Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1948*, and shall be read as one with The Bank Holidays Act, 1884 (Act 48 Vict., No. 9, as amended by Acts 52 Vict., No. 3, 63 Vict., No. 40 and No. 26 of 1921), hereinafter referred to as the principal Act.

Short title.

2. The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as *The Bank Holidays Act, 1884-1948*.

Citation of principal Act as amended by this Act.

3. The principal Act is amended by deleting the words—

Amendment of the Second Schedule to Act 63 Vict., No. 40.

“Labour Day (first day of May)” which were substituted by section two of Act No. 26 of 1921, for the words—

“Proclamation Day (twenty-first day of October)” then appearing in line six of the Second Schedule to Act 63 Vict., No. 40, and by substituting the words—

“Labour Day (first day of March)”.
