

TIMBER INDUSTRY REGULATION.

10° and 11° GEO. VI., No. XLI.

AN ACT to amend the Timber Industry Regulation Act, 1926-1937.

[Assented to 24th January, 1947.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Timber Industry Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1946*, and shall be read as one with the Timber Industry Regulation Act, 1926 (No. 59 of 1926) as amended by the Timber Industry Regulation Act Amendment Act, 1937 (No. 20 of 1937), hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.

2. The principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "aforesaid" in lines seven and eight of the definition of "Timber holding" in section two thereof the following words "and any place, whether of a kind similar to or different from any included in this definition, at which timber is stacked, sawn, split, hewn, used in joinery construction or otherwise fashioned". Amendment of s. 2.

3. The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Timber Industry Regulation Act, 1926-1946. Citation of principal Act as amended.
