

## FREMANTLE (Skinner street) DISUSED CEMETERY.

22° GEO. V., No. XV.

No. 15 of 1931.

AN ACT to provide for the vesting of certain Lands now vested in the Trustees of the Fremantle Cemetery in the City of Fremantle and amend the Fremantle (Skinner street) Disused Cemetery Act, 1909.

[Assented to 18th August, 1931.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Fremantle (Skinner street) Disused Cemetery Amendment Act, 1931*, and shall be read as one with the Fremantle (Skinner street) Disused Cemetery Act, 1909, hereinafter called the principal Act. Short title.

2. The lands vested in the trustees of the Fremantle Cemetery by section two of the principal Act are hereby vested in the city of Fremantle on the same trusts as the same are now vested in the said trustees. Fremantle disused cemetery vested in city of Fremantle.

3. The council of the city of Fremantle may cause the remains (so far as the remains can by reasonable diligence be discovered or identified) of all persons buried in the land described in the schedule to the principal Act, together with all slabs and tombstones in relation thereto, to be collected with due care and removed to the Fremantle public cemetery, and shall there cause such remains to be reverently buried and such slabs and tombstones to be re-erected and full records in each case to be entered up in the register of the said cemetery. The council of the city of Fremantle may cause the bodies in the old Skinner street cemetery to be re-interred in the Fremantle public cemetery.

4. It shall be lawful for but not obligatory on the council of the said city, in default of any arrangement being come to with the representatives or known relatives of the persons so buried to pay the cost of such re-interment, to defray the same out of the funds of the city.

On removal of all

may vest the old

5. On the Governor being satisfied that the remains of all persons have been removed and re-interred and all slabs and tombstones removed and re-erected in accordance with the provisions of section two, the Governor may by proclamation declare that the lands vested in the city of Fremantle by section one shall thenceforth be freed and discharged from all trusts previously affecting the same, to the intent that the same shall thereby be created and thenceforth used as a class A reserve for the purpose of public recreation in the same way as if it had been duly classified as such under section two of the Permanent Reserves Act, 1899.

6. The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Fremantle (*Skinner street*) *Disused Cemetery Act, 1909-1931.*
