

PARLIAMENTARY ALLOWANCES.

16° GEO. V., No. XXXII.

No. 32 of 1925.

AN ACT to further amend the Parliamentary Allowances Act, 1911.

[Assented to 16th December, 1925.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Parliamentary Allowances Act Amendment Act, 1925*, and shall be read as one with the *Parliamentary Allowances Act, 1911*, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act.

2. (1) From and after the commencement of this Act the allowance to each member of the Legislative Council and of the Legislative Assembly, payable under paragraphs (a) and (b) of section three of the principal Act, as amended by the Act No. 63 of 1919, shall be increased by two hundred pounds a year.

(2) The words "but while in receipt of such allowance shall not receive any allowance under section three" in subsections (1) and (2) of section six of the principal Act, and the proviso to section two of the *Parliamentary Allowances Act Amendment Act, 1919*, shall not apply to the allowance of two hundred a year as an increase in the allowance to members as enacted by this Act.
