**AN ACT to amend Section Four of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912.**

[Assented to 4th November, 1925.]

**B**E it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Act may be cited as the *Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1925.*

Amendment of term "worker."

2. The interpretation of the word "worker" in section four of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following words:—"The word 'worker' does not include any person employed under articles of agreement as a 'pearl fisher' within the meaning of those words in the Pearling Act, 1912, that is to say, 'for the purpose of pearling on board of a ship,' and not otherwise employed, and introduced into the State by permission of the Government of the Commonwealth, subject to the obligation of the employer to return such person to the place whence he came on the cessation of his employment."
