AN ACT to empower the Government to establish and delimit, by Proclamation, Ports and Harbours for the purposes of Ordinances 18 Victoriae, No. 15, and 37 Victoriae, No. 14, and for other relative purposes.

[Assented to 23rd March, 1917.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. This Act may be cited as the *Ports and Harbours Act, 1917.* Short title.
- 2. It shall be lawful for the Governor, by proclamation, to declare that any place bounded as set out in the proclamation shall be a port or harbour for the purpose of Ordinances 18 Victoriae, No. 15 (the Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855), and 37 Victoriae, No. 14. Governor may proclaim ports and harbours for purposes of 18 Vic., No. 15, and 37 Vic., No. 14.
- 3. The Governor may in like manner define, for the purposes of the said Ordinances, the limits of any port or harbour mentioned in the Shipping and Pilotage Consolidation Ordinance, 1855. Power to define limits of ports and harbours specified in 18 Vic., No. 15.
- 4. The Governor may, by proclamation, revoke or vary any proclamation issued under this Act. Power to revoke or vary proclamations.
