

AN ACT to amend the Perth Municipal Gas and Electric Lighting Act, 1911.

[Assented to 22nd September, 1914.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Perth Municipal Gas and Electric Lighting Act Amendment Act, 1914*, and shall be read as one with the Perth Municipal Gas and Electric Lighting Act, 1911, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.

2. The Council may expend, in and about its business of manufacturers and suppliers of gas and electric current, the unexpended balance of loan moneys borrowed by it under the provisions of the principal Act, in such manner as it may deem expedient. General powers of Council to use unexpended loan moneys.

3. Specifically and without in any manner limiting the power conferred by the preceding section, the Council shall have power to expend such moneys in purchasing and supplying free of cost to its customers all motors, lamps, and other electrical appliances and apparatus of any kind whatsoever which may be required or Special powers.
