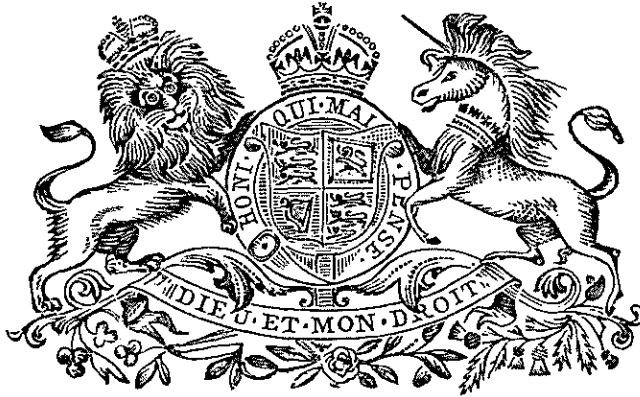

AN ACT to continue, until the month of April, 1918, the Licensing Districts as constituted by the Licensing Act, 1911, and the Local Option Resolutions in force thereunder.

[Assented to 10th February, 1915.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Local Option Vote Continuance Act, 1914.* Short title.

2. A Local Option vote under Part V. of the Licensing Act, 1911, shall not be taken in the year 1915, but the resolutions carried at the Local Option vote taken under the said Act in the month of April, 1911, shall continue in operation and effective until a Local Option vote is taken in the year 1918. Local Option resolutions continued to April, 1918.

3. Section two of the Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1911, is further amended by omitting the words "One thousand nine hundred and fifteen" in subsections one and two thereof respectively, and inserting in place thereof "One thousand nine hundred and eighteen." Amendment of section 2 of 1911, No. 46.
