AN ACT to continue, until the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen, the Licensing Districts as constituted by the Licensing Act, 1911, and the Local Option Resolutions in force thereunder.

[Assented to 30th December, 1913.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Local Option Vote Continuance Act, 1913.* Short title.

2. Section two of the Licensing Act Amendment Act, 1911, is amended by omitting the words "One thousand nine hundred and fourteen," in subsections one and two thereof respectively, and inserting in place thereof "One thousand nine hundred and fifteen." Amendment of Sec. 2 of 1911, No. 46.

3. (1) A Local Option vote under the Licensing Act, 1911, shall not be taken in the year one thousand nine hundred and fourteen and in every third year thereafter; but shall be taken in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen and in the month of April in every third year thereafter. Local Option resolutions continued until April, 1915.

(2) The resolutions carried at the Local Option vote taken under the Licensing Act, 1911, in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and eleven shall continue in operation and effective until a Local Option vote is taken in the month of April, one thousand nine hundred and fifteen as hereinbefore provided.
