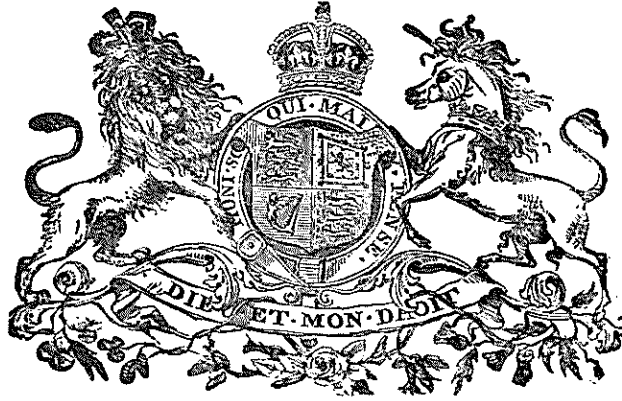

AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the Years ended the 30th day of June, One thousand nine hundred and seven, and the 30th day of June, One thousand nine hundred and eight.

[Assented to 6th February, 1909.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained Preamble.  
for certain expenditure incurred for the service of the financial year 1906-7, and also of the financial year 1907-8, not included in any Appropriation Act: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Expenditure set forth in Schedules A and B to this Act shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the State, that is to say: The sums of One hundred and twenty-six pounds one shilling and one penny, and Sixty-one thousand seven hundred and thirty-six pounds five shillings and seven pence. 2. The Expenditure set forth in Schedule C to this Act shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the General Loan Fund of the State, that is to say: The sum of Sixteen thousand five hundred and fifty-eight pounds thirteen shillings and two pence.

3. The Expenditure set forth in Schedule D to this Act shall be, and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Loan Suspense Account of the State, that is to say the sum of One thousand one hundred and four pounds seventeen shillings and five pence.
