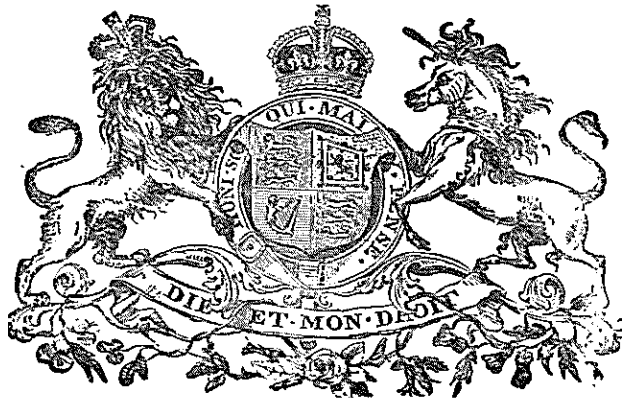

AN ACT to amend the Prisons Act, 1903.

[Assented to 13th September, 1906.]

BE it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. This Act may be cited as the *Prisons Amendment Act, 1906*, and shall be read as one with the Prisons Act, 1903, hereinafter referred to as the principal Act. Short title.

2. Section twenty-one of the principal Act is hereby amended by adding a subsection, as follows:— Amendment of 3 Edw. VII., No. 14, s. 21.

(10.) For taking the photograph, finger prints, measurements, and other particulars of any prisoner, and recording the same.

3. Section fifty-nine of the principal Act is hereby amended by inserting after the word “escapes,” in the second line thereof, the following words: “or attempts to escape.”

4. All copies of the principal Act hereafter printed by the Government Printer shall be printed as amended by this Act, under the supervision of the Clerk of the Parliaments, and a reference to this Act made in the margin.
