AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the Year ended 30th June, One thousand nine hundred and one.

[Assented to, 19th February, 1902.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained for certain expenditure incurred for the services of the year Preamble. 1900-1901, not included in any Appropriation Act for the Year: Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:-

THE Expenditure of the sum of Three hundred and sixty-four thousand three hundred and eighty-four pounds twelve shillings excesses on votes on the Consolidated and sixpence, set forth in the Schedule A to this Act, shall be, and Revenue Fund for the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

THE Expenditure of the sum of One hundred and thirty-five thousand three hundred and ninety-eight pounds eleven shillings Excesses on Votes on General Loan and three pence set forth in Schedule B to this Act, shall be, and Fund for the year the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to 1900-1901. be a charge against the General Loan Fund of the Colony.
