AN ACT to authorise the Construction of a
Railway from Cue to Nannine.

[Assented to, 27th October, 1896.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:— Preamble.

1. THIS Act may be cited as the Cue-Nannine Railway Act, Short title.
1896.

2. IT shall be lawful to construct and maintain a Railway from Cue to Nannine, with all necessary, proper, and usual works and conveniences in connection therewith, in the line described in the Schedule to this Act Authority to construct.

Deviation.

3. IT shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Railways to deviate from the line as described in such Schedule to the extent of fifteen miles on either side thereof.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.

SCHEDULE.

CUE-NANNINE RAILWAY.

DESCRIPTION OF LINE OF RAILWAY.

Commencing at a point in or near Cue Townsite, and proceeding thence in a generally North-Easterly direction for about 46 miles, and terminating at a point in or near Nannine Townsite; as more particularly delineated by a red line on Map marked P.W.D., W.A., 4855, deposited as provided for by 55° Victoriæ, No. 34, Section 10.
