AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the year ending 30th June, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six.

[Assented to, 11th December, 1897.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained for certain expenditure incurred for the services of the year 1895-6 not included in any Appropriation Act for the year: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Preamble.

The expenditure of the sum of Four hundred and ninety-three thousand three hundred and seventy-eight pounds nine shillings and fourpence set forth in the Schedule A to this Act, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Excesses on Votes of the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the year 1895-6

The expenditure of the sum of Eighty-four thousand eight hundred and sixty-six pounds one shilling and tenpence set forth in the Schedule B to this Act, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Loan Accounts of the Colony.

Excesses on Votes of the Loan Accounts for the year 1895-6.
