No. XXXVI.

AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the year ending 30th June, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-seven.

[Assented to, 23rd December, 1897.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained for certain expenditure incurred for the services of the year 1896-7 not included in any Appropriation Act for the year: Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Preamble.

The expenditure of the sum of Six hundred and nineteen thousand three hundred and ninety-nine pounds two shillings and one penny, set forth in the Schedule A to this Act, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony.

Excesses on Votes on the Consolidated Revenue Fund for the year 1896-7.

The expenditure of the sum of Ninety-two thousand one hundred and forty-nine pounds eighteen shillings and ninepence, set forth in the Schedule B to this Act, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the General Loan Fund of the Colony.

Excesses on Votes on the General Loan Fund for the year 1896-7.
