AN ACT to authorise the construction of a
Railway from Geraldton to Mullewa.

[Assented to, 18th March, 1892.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and
Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parlia-
ment assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

Preamble.

1. THIS Act may be cited as "The Geraldton-Mullewa Rail-
way Act, 1892."

Short Title.

2. IT shall be lawful to construct and maintain a Railway from
Geraldton to Mullewa, with all necessary, proper, and usual works
and conveniences in connection therewith, in the line and upon the
lands described in the Schedule to this Act.

Deviation.

3. NOTWITHSTANDING anything contained in "The Railways Act, 1878," it shall be lawful for the Commissioner of Railways to deviate from the line as described in such Schedule to the extent of five miles on either side thereof.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen I hereby assent to this Act.

SCHEDULE.

GERALDTON—MULLEWA RAILWAY.

DESCRIPTION OF LINE OF RAILWAY.

Commencing at a point on the Geraldton to Greenough Railway 6 miles and 75 chains or thereby from its commencing point on the Geraldton to Northampton Railway, and proceeding thence in an East-North-Easterly direction for a distance of 60 miles or thereabouts; and terminating at or near Mullewa Spring. All in the Land District of Victoria, as more particularly delineated by a red line on map marked P.W.D., W.A., 1465, deposited at the Office of the Commissioner of Railways, at Perth.
