AN ACT to confirm certain Expenditure for the year One thousand eight hundred and eighty-eight.

[Assented to, 29th November, 1889.]

WHEREAS it is necessary that Legislative authority be obtained for certain expenditure incurred for the services of the year 1888, not included in the Estimates or Supplementary Estimates of the year as passed by the Legislative Council: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

The expenditure of the sum of One thousand three hundred and sixty-eight pounds eighteen shillings and seven pence, set forth in the Schedule to this Act, shall be and the same is hereby confirmed and allowed, and is hereby declared to be a charge against the General Revenues of the Colony.
