AN ACT to give the Commissioner of Railways power to appoint and dismiss certain classes of Railway Servants.

[Assented to, 22nd July, 1887.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:— Preamble.

1. THAT this Act may be cited as “The Railway Servants Act, 1887.” Short title.

2. THAT the Commissioner of Railways shall have the power of appointing, of fining, and of dismissing, whether summarily or otherwise, any person falling within any class of railway servants in the Schedule to this Act mentioned. Commissioner of Railways to have power to dismiss certain persons.

3. THAT all such appointments, fines, and dismissals be subject to the approval of the Governor. Approval of the Governor.

4. THAT any fines levied and paid under the provisions of this Act shall not become and form part of the General Revenue of the Colony, but shall be paid to the Railway Servants' Benefit Society.
