An Act for the purpose of establishing a Holiday to commemorate the Foundation of Australia.

[Assented to 26th November, 1888.]

WHEREAS it is desirable that every Anniversary of the Twenty-sixth day of January be kept as a Public Holiday, in commemoration of the commencement of the settlement of Australia under the Crown in the year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and eighty-eight :

Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows :—

1. That all the provisions of 'The Bank Holidays Act, 1884,' be applicable to the twenty-sixth day of January in every year, as fully as if the said day had been included in the schedule to the said Act.

Short title

2. That this Act may be cited as 'The Bank Holidays Act, 1884, Amendment Act, 1888.'
