AN ACT to Further Amend "The Customs Ordinance, 1860."

[Assented to, 27th August, 1884.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to give greater facilities for the unloading of vessels arriving from parts beyond the seas at any port or place within the Colony: Be it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. AT any time after due report of any ship arriving from parts beyond the seas at any port or place within the Colony, and due entry of the goods on the said ship, and production to the collector or other principal officer of customs of such port or place of the manifest of the said goods, it shall be lawful for the said collector or officer in his discretion, upon application by the owner, master, or agent of the ship, or by the owner of the goods or his agent, to grant a special sufferance to the applicant to land forthwith all or any part of the goods, at his risk and expense, on any day including Sundays and holidays, and either during the legal hours mentioned in Section 31 of "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," or

After due report and entry &c. goods may be landed forthwith on any day and at any time, on the special authority of the Collector of Customs.

during such other hours as the said collector or officer may specially authorise under the provisions of the said section, but subject always to such conditions as to the collector or officer may seem fit.

Incorporation with
Customs Acts.

2. THIS Act, so far as is consistent with the tenor thereof, shall be construed together with "The Customs Ordinance, 1860," and with the other Acts modifying or amending the same.

Short title.

3. THIS Act may be cited as "The Customs Ordinance Amendment Act, 1884."
