An Act to amend 'The Industrial Schools Act, 1874.'
[Assented to 21st September, 1882.]

WHEREAS by 'The Industrial Schools Act, 1874,' it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Executive Council may, by writing under his hand, order and direct juvenile offenders in certain cases to be sent to any institution certified under the said Act which shall be willing to receive such offenders; and whereas it is expedient to appoint an institution for the reception of such offenders without obtaining the consent which is required by the said Act: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1. The Rottneſt Reformatory ſhall be, and the ſame is hereby conſtituted an inſtitution within the meaning of 'The Industrial Schools Act, 1874,' for the reception of ſuch juvenile offenders as the Governor in Council is authoriſed to order and direct to be detained, in accordance with the provisions of the ninth ſection of the ſaid Act: and the perſon in charge of the ſaid Reformatory ſhall be 'the Manager' thereof, for all the purpoſes required by the ſaid Act.

2. This Act ſhall be incorporated and read together with 'The Industrial Schools Act, 1874.'

3. The ſhort title of this Act ſhall be 'The Industrial Schools Act Amendment Act, 1882.'
