AN ACT to amend "The Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance of 1866."

[Assented to, 16th August, 1877.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance of 1866," and to insert other provisions in addition thereto: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 THE provisions of the 13th section of "The Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance, of 1866," shall not be taken or deemed to apply to infected sheep depasturing within secure enclosures.

Scab-in-Sheep—Amendment.

2 IT shall be lawful for an Inspector, if he is satisfied that any sheep are clean, to give a written permission to move such sheep such as is mentioned in section 20 of the aforesaid Ordinance.

3 THIS Act and “The Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance of 1866,” shall be read together as one Act.

4 THIS Act may be cited as “The Scab-in-Sheep Ordinance of 1866, Amendment Act, 1877.”
