AN ORDINANCE to Reduce the Duty on the Importation of Tobacco intended for Sheep Wash.

[15th July, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to reduce the duty on Tobacco intended for sheep wash, and rendered unfit for human consumption; Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its dependencies, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows:—

1 THE Ordinance No. 14, of 1866, intituled *An Ordinance to reduce the Duty on the importation of unmanufactured Tobacco*, is hereby repealed.

No. 14 of 1866, repealed.

2 FOR and in lieu of the duties of Customs now chargeable on importation of tobacco, the duty of three pence the pound weight shall be charged, levied, and paid, upon such tobacco, provided the same shall be rendered unfit for human consumption, in the manner,

3d. the lb. chargeable on the importation of tobacco, if destroyed for sheep wash.

and subject to the Regulations, which the Governor from time to time may direct by a notice published in the *Government Gazette*.

All tobacco entered or
warehoused and destroyed,
to pay 3d. the lb.

3 All manufactured and unmanufactured tobacco imported and entered for payment of duty, or warehoused without payment of duty, and rendered unfit for human consumption as hereinbefore provided, shall be liable to the reduced duty.
