AN ORDINANCE to amend and explain the Law relating  
to the Sale of Colonial Wine.

**W**HEREAS Doubts have arisen as to the minimum Quantity of Colonial Wine that may be sold without a License, and it is expedient in order to remove such Doubts to amend the second Section of the 20th Victoria, No. 2, of 1856: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia and its Dependencies by and with the Advice and Consent of the Legislative Council thereof, That the second Section of the said recited Ordinance 20th Victoria, No. 2, of 1856 intituled *An Ordinance to consolidate and amend the Laws relating to the Sale of Spirituous and Fermented Liquors* shall be read and applied as if the Words "or any Colonial Wine the Produce of Land in the said Colony in a less Quantity than Five Gallons" had been inserted therein after the words "Fifteen Gallons" in the said second Section.

Preamble.

Colonial Wine may not be sold in less quantity than 5 gallons.
