An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the colony of Western Australia to the service thereof, for the financial Year commencing First of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty-three.

WHEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor ^{Preamble.} of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the

Supplementary Expenditure of year ending 31st of March, 1842, £940 6s.

Legislative Council of the said colony, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order, and good government of the same; Be it therefore enacted by his Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said Colony there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding Nine hundred and forty Pounds, Six Shillings, for defraying the supplementary charge for the service of the year ending on the Thirty-first day of March, One thousand eight hundred and forty-two, as detailed in the annexed schedules.

II. AND be it further enacted, that out of the produce of the Revenue of the said colony, there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums not exceeding Nine thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-Eight Pounds, Twelve Shillings, and Sixpence, for defraying the expenses of those establishments chargeable on the Colonial Fund for the year commencing First of April, One thousand eight hundred and forty three, as hereinafter more particularly expressed; that is to say, any sum or sums not exceeding Forty-five pounds, Twelve shillings, and Sixpence, to defray the salary of the Acting Colonial Treasurer, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Registrar of Deeds, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Superintendent of Public Works, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred and fifty pounds to defray certain salaries of the Colonial Secretary's department, and any sum or sums not exceeding Five hundred and forty-five pounds to defray certain salaries of the Surveyor-General's department, and any sum or sums not exceeding Two hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Collector of Revenue, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Resident Magistrate Fremantle, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Resident Magistrate Leschenault, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Resident Magistrate Albany, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter Fremantle, and any sum or sums not exceeding the sum of One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter at Bunbury, and any sum or sums not exceeding Fifty pounds to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter at Perth, and any sum or sums of money not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter at Albany, and any sum or sums not exceeding One hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Harbor Master at

 at Fremantle, and any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds to defray the salary of the Constable at Guildford, and any sum or sums not exceeding Thirty-five pounds to defray the salaries of the Constables Albany.

Treasurer to pay over salaries, &c., as the Governor shall direct.

III. AND be it further enacted, that the Treasurer of the said Colony shall issue and pay the said sums to such persons, for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct, and that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of the Revenue of the said Colony.

Receipts of parties to be a sufficient discharge to Treasurer.

IV AND be it further enacted, that the said Treasurer shall in his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in writing as aforesaid, and that the Receipt or Receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any such sum
