An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof for the Financial Year commencing the first of April, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty.

THEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order, and good government of the same; and whereas it is expedient to apply certain sums arising from the revenue of the said Colony to the service thereof for the financial year commencing the 1st of April, one thousand May be applied out of the eight hundred and forty: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor produce of the colonial of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative ceeding £5,121 12s 6d, to Council thereof, that out of the produce of the revenue of the said support establishments chargeable on the colonial Colony there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums that out of the colonial chargeable on the coloni of money not exceeding Five Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-
