An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof for the Financial Year commencing the first of April, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Forty.

WHEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, to make, ordain, and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order, and good government of the same; and whereas it is expedient to apply certain sums arising from the revenue of the said Colony to the service thereof for the financial year commencing the 1st of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty: Be it therefore enacted by the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, that out of the produce of the revenue of the said Colony there shall and may be issued and applied any sum or sums of money not exceeding Five Thousand One Hundred and Twenty-

May be applied out of the produce of the colonial revenue, any sum not exceeding £5,121 12s 6d, to support establishments chargeable on the colonial fund, for Financial year;

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one Pounds, Twelve Shillings, and sixpence, for defraying the expenses of those establishments chargeable on the Colonial Fund for the year commencing the 1st of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, as hereinafter more particularly expressed—that is to say, any sum or sums not exceeding forty-five pounds, twelve shillings, and sixpence, to defray the salary of the office of Colonial Treasurer; and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds to defray the salary of the Registrar of Deeds; and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds, to defray the salary of the Superintendent of Public Works; and any sum or sums not exceeding seventy-five pounds, to defray the extra expenses of the Colonial Secretary's department; and any sum or sums not exceeding four hundred and ninety-five pounds, to defray the extra expenses of the Surveyor General's department; and any sum or sums not exceeding two hundred pounds, to defray the salary of the Collector of Revenue; and any sum or sums not exceeding fifty pounds, to defray the salary of the Sub-Collector, Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding eighty pounds, to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter and Warehousekeeper at Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding twenty-five pounds to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter at Perth; and any sum or sums not exceeding twenty-five pounds, to defray the salary of the Tidewaiter at Albany; and any sum or sums not exceeding thirty pounds, to defray the salary of the Medical Attendant, Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds, to defray the expense of the Harbour Master, Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds, to defray the expense of the Harbour Master, Albany; and any sum or sums not exceeding one hundred pounds, to defray the salary of the Gaoler, Fremantle; and any sum or sums not exceeding thirty pounds, to defray the salary of the Gaoler, Albany; and any sum or sums not exceeding thirty-five pounds, to defray the salary of the Postmaster, Perth; and any sum or sums not exceeding thirty-five pounds, to defray the salary of the Postmaster, Fremantle; any sum or sums not exceeding fifteen pounds, to defray the salary of the Postmaster, Albany; and any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds, to defray the salary of the Bailiff of the Civil Court: any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds, to defray the salary of the Constable, Perth; any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds, to defray the salary of the Constable, Fremantle; any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds, to defray the salary of the Constable, Guildford; any sum or sums not exceeding twenty pounds, to defray the salary of the Constable, Albany; any sum or sums not exceeding ten pounds, to defray the salary of the Constable, Murray River; and any sum or sums not exceeding thirty-five pounds, to defray the salary of the Government Office Housekeeper; and any sum or sums not exceeding ninety pounds,
