An Act for applying certain Sums arising from the Revenue receivable in the Colony of Western Australia to the Service thereof, for the Financial Year commencing first April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two.

WHEREAS power and authority have been vested in the Governor of Western Australia, acting with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of the said Colony, to make, ordain and establish all such Laws and Ordinances as may be necessary for the maintenance of the peace, order and good government of the same: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Western Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative

as the Governor for the time being, by any warrant or order in writ-
ing so signed by him, shall from time to time order and direct; and
that the payment so made shall be charged upon and payable out of
the Revenue of the said colony.

Receipts of parties to be III. AND be it further enacted, that the said Treasurer shall in
sufficient discharge to his accounts from time to time be allowed credit for any sum or
Treasurer. sums of money paid by him in pursuance of such warrant or order in
writing as aforesaid, and that the receipt or receipts of the respective
persons to whom the same shall be so paid, shall be a full and valid
discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said accounts for any
such sum or sums of money as shall be therein mentioned, and that
he shall and do receive credit for the same accordingly.
