An Act to appropriate out of the Consolidated Account a sum for capital payments made during the year ended 30 June 2010 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2010*.

[Assented to 2 May 2011]

The Parliament of Western Australia enacts as follows:

s. 1

1. Short title

This is the *Appropriation (Consolidated Account) Capital 2009-10 (Supplementary) Act 2011*.

2. Commencement

This Act comes into operation as follows —

- (a) sections 1 and 2 — on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent;
- (b) the rest of the Act — on the day after that day.

3. Appropriation for capital purposes

The sum of \$94 447 000, being payments of an extraordinary or unforeseen nature made for the year ended 30 June 2010 under the authority of the *Financial Management Act 2006* and the *Treasurer's Advance Authorisation Act 2010* and charged to the Consolidated Account under the *Financial Management Act 2006*, is appropriated for the capital purposes expressed in Schedule 1.
