Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Declared Pest Account) Regulations 2014

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Declared Pest Account) Regulations 2014*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.

3. Prescribed areas

The local government districts specified in the Table are prescribed as areas for the purposes of section 130(1) of the Act.

4. Consultation requirement

- (1) In this regulation —

affected land, in relation to a proposal to determine a rate under section 130 of the Act, means the land or the class of land in respect of which it is proposed to determine the rate;

relevant newspaper, in relation to a proposal to determine a rate under section 130 of the Act, means a newspaper circulating generally in the area in which the affected land is situated.

- (2) Not less than one month before determining a rate chargeable on land under section 130 of the Act, the Minister must —
- (a) publish a notice in a relevant newspaper —
 - (i) identifying the affected land; and
 - (ii) stating the rate that the Minister proposes to determine; and
 - (iii) inviting submissions from interested persons regarding the proposed determination;
 - and
 - (b) in so far as is reasonably practicable, send by post a copy of the notice to each owner of affected land.

5. *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Declared Pest Account Rate Consultation) Regulations 2011 repealed*

The *Biosecurity and Agriculture Management (Declared Pest Account Rate Consultation) Regulations 2011* are repealed.
