Fish Resources Management Act 1994

**Fish Resources Management Amendment
Regulations (No. 3) 2010**

Made by the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in Executive Council.

1. Citation

These regulations are the *Fish Resources Management Amendment Regulations (No. 3) 2010*.

2. Commencement

These regulations come into operation as follows —

- (a) regulations 1 and 2 — on the day on which these regulations are published in the *Gazette*;
- (b) the rest of the regulations — on the day after that day.
