LOTTERIES COMMISSION ACT 1990
LOTTERIES COMMISSION (SATURDAY LOTTO) RULES 1995

Made by the Commission under section 28 (1).

PART 1 — PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. These rules may be cited as the *Lotteries Commission (Saturday Lotto) Rules 1995*.

Commencement

2. These rules come into operation on 20 November 1995.

Interpretation

3. In these rules —

“agent” means a person authorized by the Commission to process entry coupons;

“Australian Lotto Bloc” means a group made up of the Commission and the designated authorities in relation to —

- (a) the State of Queensland;
- (b) the State of South Australia; and
- (c) the State of Victoria;

“claim period” means the period of time from that Saturday lotto draw or super 66 draw to the close of business —

- (a) on the second Friday after that Saturday lotto draw; or
- (b) where the second Friday after that Saturday lotto draw is a public holiday, on the preceding business day before that Friday;

“first draw” means that part of a Saturday lotto draw which involves the mechanical, equally random selection of 8 numbered balls selected from balls individually numbered from 1 to 45 inclusive, in a manner and using such equipment as the Commission determines to be adequate;

“game” means —

- (a) in relation to a Saturday lotto draw, a single entry in which between 4 and 20 numbers inclusive out of 45 are selected, and which, individually, may constitute part, or all, of a lotto coupon;
- (b) in relation to a system entry, the notional multiple games making up that single system entry;
- (c) in respect of a super 66 draw, a single 6 digit number selected, of which one or more may be entered per entry coupon;

“payout period” means the period from the Monday after that Saturday lotto draw or super 66 draw to the close of business one year from that Saturday lotto draw or super 66 draw;

“prize pool” means —

- (a) for a Saturday lotto draw, 55% of all subscriptions received for that Saturday lotto draw; and
- (b) for a super 66 draw, 56.5% of all subscriptions received for that super 66 draw;

“receipted ticket” means a ticket that is produced and issued by an agent either as a result of processing an entry coupon, or as a response to an oral request by a subscriber;

“Saturday” means Saturday evening;

“Saturday lotto draw” includes the first draw and the second draw of lotto conducted in accordance with these rules;

“second draw” means that part of a Saturday lotto draw which involves the mechanical, equally random selection of 6 numbered balls selected from balls individually numbered from 1 to 45 inclusive, in a manner and using such equipment as the Commission determines to be adequate;

“selling period” means the period of time terminating at 5.00 p.m. on that Saturday, or 4.00 p.m. on that Saturday, if so determined by the Commission from time to time;

“super 66 draw” means a draw described in Part 6 that may be entered as a supplement to Saturday lotto;

“supplementary number” in relation to a first draw, means one of the last 2 numbers drawn;

“total prize pool” means the prize pool for that draw, plus any jackpot amount from a previous draw and any amount from the prize reserve fund that has been taken from the fund to ensure that a guaranteed minimum prize pool for the draw, and super 66, is met;

“winning number” means —

- (a) in relation to a first draw, any one of the first 6 numbers drawn in that first draw;
- (b) in relation to a second draw, any one of the numbers drawn in that second draw;
- (c) in relation to a super 66 draw, the number made up by the 6 digits drawn in any one super 66 draw, in the order drawn.

PART 2 — REQUIREMENTS FOR ENTRY

Entry coupon

4. (1) The Commission must ensure that an entry coupon for a Saturday lotto draw —

- (a) displays such details to facilitate entry as the Commission thinks necessary; and
- (b) displays any instructions which the Commission may from time to time approve.

(2) An entry coupon may be rejected by the agent as an invalid entry, at the time of presentation by the subscriber, if —

- (a) it has not been marked by hand in blue ball point pen in accordance with the conditions on that entry coupon; or
- (b) it has been generated or marked by mechanical or electrical means.

Methods of entry

5. (1) A person may enter a Saturday lotto draw using any or all of the following methods —

- (a) by filling out an entry coupon so as to select between 4 and 20 numbers from the numbers 1 to 45;
- (b) by oral request for a selection of between 4 and 20 numbers from the numbers 1 to 45,

and by paying the appropriate amount set out in Schedule 1.

(2) A Saturday lotto entry must be specified to be —

- (a) for 1 week or for 2, 5 or 10 consecutive weeks; and
- (b) with or without a supplementary entry or entries in a super 66 draw or draws.

(3) A Saturday lotto entry that has been correctly completed is an entry for both the first draw and the second draw on that Saturday.

Super 66 entry

6. (1) A person wishing to enter a super 66 draw in conjunction with a Saturday lotto entry may only do so when the minimum number of Saturday lotto games set out in rule 8 are also being entered.

(2) Subject to subrule (1), a subscriber may enter either one, 2, 4, 8, or 10 super 66 games in a super 66 draw, in conjunction with a Saturday lotto entry —

- (a) by marking the entry coupon in the appropriate box; or
- (b) by making an oral request for the number of super 66 games to be entered in that draw,

and paying \$1.00 per super 66 game entered.

Super 66 receipted ticket

7. (1) Where a super 66 draw or draws are entered in conjunction with a Saturday lotto entry, a separate receipted ticket must be generated for the super 66 games entered.

(2) Each super 66 receipted ticket will have a random selection of 6 digits, generated by computer, printed on it and those digits are the subscriber's selected digits for that draw.

Completion of entry coupon

8. (1) To enter a Saturday lotto draw using an entry coupon, a subscriber must —

- (a) select 6 numbers out of the numbers 1 to 45 for each of at least 4 games on the entry coupon commencing with the game marked "1"; or
- (b) select between 4 and 20 numbers (other than 6 numbers) out of the numbers 1 to 45 in one or more games on the entry coupon, commencing with the game marked "1".

(2) For entry into a Saturday lotto draw and, if required, a super 66 draw or draws, the subscriber must also mark in the appropriate boxes on the entry coupon —

- (a) that the entry is for a Saturday lotto draw;
- (b) where applicable, how many super 66 games are to be entered using that entry coupon;
- (c) how many, if any, consecutive weeks the entry coupon is to be entered; and

- (d) whether the method of entry is a "systems" entry, being either a systems 4-5 or a systems 7-20, depending on the number of numbers selected in each game,

and must pay the amount calculated in accordance with Schedule 1 and \$1.00 per super 66 game entered.

(3) Where between 4 and 20 numbers (other than 6 numbers) are selected out of the numbers 1 to 45 in the game marked "1" —

- (a) if 4, 5, 7, or 8 numbers are selected, then up to 11 further games may be marked by selecting the same number of numbers as were selected in the game marked "1"; or
- (b) if between 9 and 20 numbers are selected then up to 4 further games may be marked by selecting the same number of numbers as were selected in the game marked "1".

(4) After the subscriber has completed the requirements in this rule, the agent must use that entry coupon to generate a receipted ticket or tickets.

Oral request for entry

9. (1) To enter a Saturday lotto draw without an entry coupon, a subscriber must make an oral request at the selling point and a receipted ticket or tickets must be produced in accordance with the subscriber's instructions.

(2) A subscriber's oral request must state —

- (a) whether the subscriber wishes to select —
 - (i) 6 numbers out of the numbers 1 to 45 — in which case the single receipted ticket will be entered for 12 games; or
 - (ii) between 4 and 20 numbers (other than 6) out of the numbers 1 to 45 — in which case the single receipted ticket will be entered for one game;
- (b) that the entry is for a Saturday lotto draw;
- (c) the week, or number of consecutive weeks, the entry is to be entered;
- (d) whether the entry is to include a super 66 game and, if so, how many, with a limit of 10 per receipted ticket.

(3) A Saturday lotto entry that has been requested is an entry for both the first draw and the second draw on that Saturday.

(4) A receipted ticket or tickets must be given to the subscriber upon payment of the amount calculated in accordance with Schedule 1 and payment of \$1.00 per super 66 game entered.

No limit to number of entries

10. A subscriber is not limited in the number of entries which may be made in a Saturday lotto draw or in any super 66 draw.

Accuracy of receipted ticket

11. (1) An agent who —

- (a) processes an entry coupon, resulting in a receipted ticket; or
- (b) produces a receipted ticket as a result of an oral request,

is under no duty to ensure that the entry coupon or request is accurately processed or reproduced on the receipted ticket.

(2) Where a receipted ticket is produced which —

- (a) is not an accurate reproduction of the details on the entry coupon used to generate the ticket; or
- (b) does not accurately reflect the oral request for an entry,

the subscriber may return the receipted ticket —

- (c) to the selling point at which it was purchased;
- (d) on the day on which it was purchased;
- (e) prior to the close of the day's lotto business for that selling point; and
- (f) within the selling period for that ticket.

(3) Upon returning the receipted ticket under subrule (2) the subscriber may surrender that receipted ticket in exchange for —

- (a) a full refund of the subscription; or
- (b) a further receipted ticket.

Validity of receipted ticket

12. A receipted ticket is an acknowledgement by the Commission that it has accepted that entry, as appearing on the ticket, in the Saturday lotto draw for the numbered Saturday(s) shown on the ticket and, where applicable, in the numbered super 66 draw or draws unless —

- (a) that receipted ticket has been returned or surrendered in accordance with rule 11 (2) or rule 13;
- (b) that receipted ticket has been found to be invalid, as a result of non-compliance with rule 4 (2), during the selling period prior to the relevant Saturday lotto draw or super 66 draw; or

- (c) the receipted ticket is forged, altered or obtained as a direct result of fraud by the subscriber or person claiming a prize.

Surrender of receipted ticket

13. The holder of a receipted ticket may surrender that ticket, whether under the provisions of rule 11 (2) or for any other reason —

- (a) to the selling point at which it was purchased;
- (b) on the day on which it was purchased;
- (c) prior to the close of the day's lotto business for that selling point; and
- (d) within the selling period for that ticket,

and if the subscriber does so, the subscriber is entitled to a full refund or a further receipted ticket in exchange for the surrendered ticket.

Entry by mail

14. (1) Subject to subrule (2), the Commission must produce a receipted ticket where an entry coupon is delivered by mail and completed in accordance with these rules, and accompanied by the correct payment.

(2) Where payment is tendered by cheque with an entry coupon delivered by mail, the Commission is under no duty to issue the receipted ticket until after that cheque has been cleared.

(3) Where payment is tendered with an entry coupon delivered by mail and the payment (although sufficient to enter the minimum number of games) is insufficient to enable the requested number of games to be entered, the Commission may enter the maximum number of games that could be entered using the money tendered, and refund any balance to the subscriber.

(4) If an entry coupon is received by the Commission by mail, together with the correct payment, and one or more of the games contains too many selected numbers, the Commission may ignore the highest additional number or numbers when producing a receipted ticket from that entry coupon.

(5) If an entry coupon is received by the Commission by mail, together with correct payment, and that coupon is bent or creased to the extent that a computer terminal will not accept or correctly read the coupon, the Commission may produce a receipted ticket that reflects the Commission's determination of the subscribers intentions as shown by the coupon, and the subscriber is bound by any such determination.

(6) If a request for a receipted ticket is received by the Commission by mail, together with correct payment, and a coupon is not enclosed, the Commission may produce a receipted ticket that reflects the request, and the subscriber is bound by the Commission's production of that receipted ticket.

(7) If an entry coupon is received by the Commission by mail, together with correct payment, and that coupon is specified as being —

- (a) a single week entry for a numbered Saturday lotto draw; or
- (b) a multiweek entry commencing with a numbered Saturday lotto draw,

the Commission must enter the subscriber in that Saturday lotto draw, or sequence of draws, unless —

- (c) the selling period for that single numbered Saturday lotto draw has passed, in which case the receipted ticket will be issued for the next Saturday lotto draw;
- (d) the selling period for that initial numbered Saturday lotto draw has passed, in which case the receipted ticket will be issued for a sequence of draws commencing with the next Saturday lotto draw.

(8) A receipted ticket under this rule must be posted by the Commission to the return address accompanying the entry coupon using ordinary mail.

(9) The Commission is not responsible for the security or loss of a receipted ticket after it has been posted.

PART 3 — GENERAL DUTIES OF COMMISSION

Saturday lotto draws and super 66 draws to be numbered

15. (1) Each Saturday on which a Saturday lotto draw is conducted by the Commission is to be identified with a “draw number”.

(2) A Saturday “draw number” also applies to a super 66 draw that takes place on that Saturday.

Lotto to be supervised

16. Each Saturday lotto draw is to be supervised in a manner specified by the Commission.

Publication of results

17. (1) Each time a Saturday lotto draw is conducted and each time super 66 is drawn, the Commission must publish —

- (a) the identifying “draw number” for that Saturday lotto draw;
- (b) all winning and supplementary numbers;
- (c) the prize pool for each division (including the division 1 prize pools for both the first draw and the second draw for that Saturday lotto draw);

- (d) the amount allocated per winning entry in each division; and
- (e) the claim period and the date after which the division 1 prizes for both the first draw and the second draw will be paid;
- (f) the amount, if any, to carry over as a jackpot to either the first draw division 1 prize pool or the second draw division 1 prize pool for the next Saturday lotto draw; and
- (g) the total prize pool for that Saturday lotto draw (ie. the sum of the prize pools for each division, both first and second draws),

in a daily newspaper in this State, after that Saturday lotto draw.

(2) Each time super 66 is drawn, the Commission must publish —

- (a) the winning number;
- (b) the prize pool for each division;
- (c) the amount allocated per winning entry in each division;
- (d) the claim period and the date after which the division 1 prize (or prizes) will be paid;
- (e) the amount, if any, to carry over as a jackpot to the next draw; and
- (f) the total prize pool for that super 66 draw (ie. the sum of the prize pools for each division),

in a daily newspaper in this State, after that Saturday lotto draw.

PART 4 — SATURDAY LOTTO DRAW: FIRST DRAW

Criteria for first draw prizes

18. In a Saturday lotto draw, for the first draw, the holder of a receipted ticket wins —

- (a) division 1, if 6 winning numbers are selected in any one game;
- (b) division 2, if any 5 of the 6 winning numbers and either one of the 2 supplementary numbers are selected in the one game;
- (c) division 3, if any 5 of the 6 winning numbers are selected in the one game;
- (d) division 4 if any 4 of the 6 winning numbers are selected in the one game; and
- (e) division 5 if any 3 of the 6 winning numbers and either one of the 2 supplementary numbers are selected in the one game.

Only systems entry can win in more than one division per game

19. (1) An entry in which 6 numbers have been selected per game does not entitle the holder of the receipted ticket to claim to have won in more than 1 division per game in the first draw.

(2) An entry in which 4 to 20 numbers (other than 6 numbers) have been selected may entitle the holder of the receipted ticket to claim to have won in more than 1 division per game in the first draw, as set out in Schedule 2.

Distribution of lotto prize pool

20. (1) The Commission must distribute the lotto prize pool for a Saturday lotto draw as follows —

First Draw:

- (a) division 1 — 22.5% of the prize pool;
- (b) division 2 — 5.5% of the prize pool;
- (c) division 3 — 10.0% of the prize pool;
- (d) division 4 — 17.5% of the prize pool; and
- (e) division 5 — 22.0% of the prize pool;

Second Draw:

- (f) division 1 — 22.5% of the prize pool.

(2) The prize pool in a division will be distributed by allocating the prize money in equal shares to each winning game in that division.

(3) The Commission may round off the individual entitlement for a prize in any division (other than division 1) to the nearest sum containing a 5 cent multiple.

(4) Where a rounding off process takes place under subrule (3), the Commission may adjust the payout for division 1 to ensure that the prize pool is distributed.

First draw division 1 jackpot

21. (1) If no one is entitled to a first draw division 1 prize in a particular Saturday lotto draw, then the first draw division 1 prize pool for that Saturday lotto draw must be added to, and form a part of, the next Saturday lotto draw's first draw division 1 prize pool.

(2) Where there is no first draw division 1 prize winner for 5 consecutive Saturday lotto draws, the Commission must allocate the accumulated first draw division 1 prize pool for the 5th Saturday lotto draw to the prize pool to the first draw division 2 winners in that Saturday lotto draw.

(3) If a first draw division 1 prize pool is distributed to first draw division 2 winners, the prize money is still treated as a division 1 prize for the purposes of making a claim.

First draw divisions 2 - 4 prize pools may go to next lower division

22. (1) If no one is entitled to a first draw division 2 prize in a particular Saturday lotto draw, then the prize pool for division 2 must be added to the prize pool for the next lower division in which there is at least one winner in that Saturday lotto draw.

(2) If no one is entitled to a first draw division 3 prize in a particular Saturday lotto draw, then the prize pool for division 3 must be added to the prize pool for the next lower division in which there is at least one winner in that Saturday lotto draw.

(3) If no one is entitled to a first draw division 4 prize in a particular Saturday, then the prize pool for division 4 must be added to the division 5 prize pool in that Saturday lotto draw.

Variation of first draw division 1 lotto prize pool

23. (1) Where less than 60% of the subscription money received for a particular Saturday lotto draw is allocated to the prize pool for that Saturday lotto draw, the Commission may add part or all of the undistributed balance of that 60% equally to a first draw division 1 prize pool and a second draw division 1 prize pool in an ensuing Saturday lotto draw (called a "Bonus" draw).

(2) The Commission may from time to time fix a minimum guaranteed prize pool for a first draw division 1 on a Saturday with a "Bonus" draw.

(3) Where a "Bonus" draw is fixed under this rule, and a jackpot first draw division 1 lotto prize coincides with that draw, the Commission may elect to reduce the undistributed balance set out in subrule (1) by the amount of the first draw division 1 jackpot amount for that draw, and retain that part of the undistributed balance for a future "Bonus" draw.

Prize reserve fund

24. (1) Subject to subrule (2), the Commission may enter into an agreement with other members of the Australian Lotto Bloc for each of the members of the Bloc to set aside the same percentage of subscriptions received by those members in order to create a prize reserve fund.

(2) The percentage of subscriptions set aside by the members under subrule (1) cannot exceed 5.0%.

(3) The prize reserve fund is constituted by the total of the amounts set aside under subrule (1).

(4) Distribution of the prize reserve fund must be as additional prize money, in such amounts and on such Saturdays, as are agreed by the Australian Lotto Bloc members.

Combination of jackpot and prize reserve amount to form single division 1 prize pool

25. (1) If a jackpot is available for a first draw division 1 prize pool and an amount is to be distributed from the prize reserve fund for that first draw division 1 prize pool, then both amounts form a single first draw division 1 prize pool for the purposes of these rules.

(2) The Commission may from time to time guarantee that a minimum amount for the first draw division 1 prize pool will be available for a particular Saturday lotto draw.

Presentation of receipted ticket — first draw division 1 prize

26. Subject to rule 51, the Commission may refuse to pay any first draw division 1 prize entitlement to the holder of a receipted ticket that has won a first draw division 1 prize in a Saturday lotto draw if the receipted ticket has not been presented at the Commission's head office within the relevant claim period under these rules.

Payment of division 1 or 2 prizes

27. (1) Subject to these rules, the Commission must pay any first draw division 1 prizes —

- (a) after the claim period under these rules has passed; and
- (b) by cheque.

(2) Subject to these rules, the Commission must pay any division 2 prizes —

- (a) at any time during the payout period that the receipted ticket is presented; and
- (b) by cheque.

Payment of division 3, 4 and 5 prizes

28. (1) Subject to these rules, division 3, 4 or 5 prizes may be collected in cash at any selling point upon presentation of the winning receipted ticket.

(2) Where any holder of a receipted ticket wins a first draw or second draw division 1 prize and another division prize on the one ticket, the Commission must not pay any of those prizes until the claim period under these rules has passed.

(3) Unless otherwise agreed with the Commission, an agent may only pay out Saturday lotto prizes that are for \$500 or less.

(4) An agent must not pay any prize that is outside the payment period for that prize.

PART 5 — SATURDAY LOTTO DRAW: SECOND DRAW

Criteria for second draw prize

29. In a Saturday lotto draw, for the second draw, the holder of a receipted ticket wins division 1, if 6 winning numbers are selected in one game.

Calculation of second draw division 1 prize

30. (1) The Commission must calculate the second draw division 1 prize pool in accordance with rule 20 (1), and must announce the amount of that pool at the time of the second draw.

(2) The prize pool in division 1 will be distributed by allocating the prize money to —

- (a) the holder of the winning receipted ticket; or
- (b) in equal shares to each winning game in that division.

Subscriber may win first draw and second draw prizes on same receipted ticket

31. (1) A subscriber may win both a first draw prize and the second draw division 1 prize on the same receipted ticket.

(2) A subscriber may win both the first draw division 1 prize and the second draw division 1 prize on the same receipted ticket, even if the winning numbers in each draw (although identical) are drawn in a different sequence.

Systems entry can only win one second draw division 1 prize

32. An entry in which 4 to 20 numbers (other than 6 numbers) have been selected may entitle the holder of the receipted ticket to claim to have won in more than 1 division per game in the first draw, as set out in Schedule 2, but only entitle the holder of that ticket to claim one division 1 second draw prize per game.

Second draw division 1 jackpot

33. (1) If no one is entitled to a second draw division 1 prize in a particular Saturday lotto draw, then the second draw division 1 prize pool for that Saturday lotto draw must be added to, and form a part of, the next Saturday lotto draw's second draw division 1 prize pool.

(2) Where there is no second draw division 1 prize winner for 5 consecutive Saturday lotto draws, the Commission must allocate the accumulated second draw division 1 prize pool for the 5th Saturday lotto draw to the prize pool for the first draw division 1 winners in that Saturday lotto draw.

Variation of second draw division 1 lotto prize pool

34. (1) Where less than 60% of the subscription money received for a particular Saturday lotto draw is allocated to the prize pool for that Saturday lotto draw, the Commission may add part or all of the undistributed balance of that 60% equally to a first draw division 1 prize pool and a second draw division 1 prize pool in an ensuing Saturday lotto draw (called a "Bonus" draw).

(2) The Commission may from time to time fix a minimum guaranteed prize pool for a second draw division 1 for a Saturday lotto draw with a "Bonus" draw.

(3) Where a "Bonus" draw is fixed under this rule, and a jackpot second draw division 1 prize coincides with that draw, the Commission may elect to reduce the undistributed balance calculated under subrule (1) by the amount of the second draw division 1 jackpot amount for that draw, and retain that part of the undistributed balance for a future "Bonus" draw.

Combination of jackpot and prize reserve amount to form single division 1 prize pool

35. (1) If a jackpot is available for a second draw division 1 prize pool and an amount is to be distributed from the prize reserve fund for that second draw division 1 prize pool, then both amounts form a single second draw division 1 prize pool for the purposes of these rules.

(2) The Commission may from time to time guarantee that a minimum amount for the second draw division 1 prize pool will be available for a particular Saturday lotto draw.

Presentation of receipted ticket — second draw division 1 prize

36. Subject to rule 51, the Commission may refuse to pay any second draw division 1 prize entitlement to the holder of a receipted ticket that has won a second draw division 1 prize in a Saturday lotto draw if the receipted ticket has not been presented at the Commission's head office within the relevant claim period under these rules.

Payment of second draw division 1 prizes

37. Subject to these rules, the Commission must pay any second draw division 1 prizes —

- (a) after the claim period under these rules has passed; and
- (b) by cheque.

PART 6 — SUPER 66 DRAW

Method of drawing super 66 numbers

38. (1) For every super 66 draw, there must be 6 digits selected, each between 0 and 9, using an equally random method of selection for each digit, at a location and on Saturdays determined by the Commission.

(2) The 6 digits drawn under subrule (1) make up the winning super 66 number for that draw.

Criteria for super 66 prizes

- 39.** (1) In a super 66 draw the holder of a receipted ticket wins —
- (a) division 1, if 6 digits in one super 66 game match the value, position and order of the 6 digits drawn;
 - (b) division 2, if 5 digits in one super 66 game match the value, position and order of —
 - (i) the first, second, third, fourth and fifth digits; or
 - (ii) the second, third, fourth, fifth and sixth digits,
 of the 6 digits drawn;
 - (c) division 3, if 4 digits in the one super 66 game match the value, position and order of —
 - (i) the first, second, third and fourth digits; or
 - (ii) the third, fourth, fifth and sixth digits,
 of the 6 digits drawn;
 - (d) division 4, if 3 digits in the one super 66 game match the value, position and order of —
 - (i) the first, second and third digits; or
 - (ii) the fourth, fifth and sixth digits,
 of the 6 digits drawn;
 - (e) division 5, if 2 digits in the one super 66 game match the value, position and order of —
 - (i) the first and second digits; or
 - (ii) the fifth and sixth digits, of the 6 digits drawn.

(2) A maximum of one prize per super 66 game entered will be paid to the receipted ticket holder by the Commission and, where the criteria for more than one division or prize is satisfied in one super 66 game, the highest prize only will be paid.

Distribution of super 66 prize pool

40. (1) Subject to subrule (2) and rule 41, the Commission must distribute the super 66 prize pool for each super 66 draw as follows —

- (a) division 1 —
 - (i) the balance of the super 66 prize pool after payment of prizes referred to in paragraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e); or
 - (ii) if a minimum first division amount is nominated prior to the draw by the Commission, that minimum amount, whichever is the higher amount;
- (b) division 2 — \$6 666.00 per winning super 66 game in that division;
- (c) division 3 — \$666.00 per winning super 66 game in that division;
- (d) division 4 — \$66.00 per winning super 66 game in that division; and
- (e) division 5 — \$6.60 per winning super 66 game in that division.

(2) Where under subrule (1) (a) a minimum amount has been nominated prior to the super 66 draw, and that minimum amount is higher than the balance of the super 66 prize pool after the payment of division 2, 3, 4 and 5 prizes, the division 1 payout may be drawn from or supplemented by the prize reserve fund.

Variation of division 1 super 66 pool

41. (1) Where less than 60% of the subscription money received for a particular super 66 draw is allocated to the prize pool for that super 66 draw, the Commission may add part or all of the undistributed balance of that 60% to a division 1 prize pool in an ensuing super 66 draw (called a “Bonus” draw).

(2) The Commission may from time to time fix a minimum guaranteed prize pool for division 1 in a “Bonus” super 66 draw.

(3) Where a “Bonus” super 66 draw is fixed under subrule (2) and a jackpot division 1 super 66 prize coincides with that draw, the Commission may elect to reduce the total of funds allocated in accordance with subrule (1) by the amount of the division 1 jackpot amount for that draw, and retain that part of the total of funds allocated, for a future “Bonus” super 66 draw.

Jackpot — super 66 draw

42. (1) If no one is entitled to a super 66 division 1 prize on a particular Saturday, then the division 1 prize pool for that super 66 draw must be added to, and form a part of, the next super 66 draw’s division 1 prize.

(2) Where there is no super 66 division 1 prize winner for 5 consecutive draws, the Commission must allocate the accumulated division 1 prize in the 5th draw to the prize pool for the division 2 winners in that draw.

(3) If a super 66 division 1 prize is distributed to division 2 winners, the prize money is still treated as a division 1 prize for the purposes of making a claim.

(4) This rule is subject to rule 40.

Divisions 2 - 4 super 66 prize pools may go to next lower division

43. (1) If no one is entitled to a super 66 division 2 prize in a particular draw, then the prize pool for division 2 must be added to the prize pool for the next lower division in which there is at least one winner in that draw.

(2) If no one is entitled to a super 66 division 3 prize in a particular draw, then the prize pool for division 3 must be added to the prize pool for the next lower division in which there is at least one winner in that draw.

(3) If no one is entitled to a super 66 division 4 prize in a particular draw, then the prize pool for division 4 must be added to the prize pool for division 5 in that draw.

Super 66 prize reserve fund

44. (1) Subject to subrule (2), the Commission may enter into an agreement with the other members of the Australian Lotto Bloc for each of the members of the Bloc to set aside the same percentage of super 66 subscriptions received by those members in order to create a prize reserve fund.

(2) The percentage of subscriptions set aside by the members under subrule (1) cannot exceed 3.5%.

(3) The prize reserve fund is constituted by the total of the amounts set aside under subrule (1).

(4) Distribution of the prize reserve fund must be as additional prize money, in such amounts and in such super 66 draws, as are agreed by the Australian Lotto Bloc members.

Presentation of receipted ticket — super 66 division 1 prize

45. Subject to rule 51, the Commission may refuse to pay any super 66 division 1 prize entitlement to the holder of a receipted ticket that has won a super 66 division 1 prize in a super 66 draw if the receipted ticket has not been presented at the Commission's head office within the relevant claim period under these rules.

Payment of super 66 division 1 or 2 prizes

46. (1) Subject to these rules, the Commission must pay any super 66 division 1 prizes —

- (a) after the claim period under these rules has passed; and
- (b) by cheque.

(2) Subject to these rules, the Commission must pay any super 66 division 2 prizes —

- (a) at any time during the payout period that the receipted ticket is presented; and
- (b) by cheque.

Payment of super 66 division 3, 4 and 5 prizes

47. (1) Subject to these rules, super 66 division 3, 4 or 5 prizes may be collected in cash at any selling point upon presentation of the winning receipted ticket.

(2) Where the holder of a receipted ticket bearing 2, 4, 8 or 10 super 66 games, wins a division 1 prize and another division prize on the one ticket, the Commission must not pay any of those prizes until the claim period under these rules has passed.

(3) Unless otherwise agreed with the Commission, an agent may only pay out super 66 prizes that are for \$500 or less.

(4) An agent must not pay any super 66 prize that is outside the payment period for that prize.

PART 7 — MISCELLANEOUS

Identification of receipted ticket holder

48. (1) The Commission may refuse to pay any division 1 Saturday lotto prize or division 1 super 66 prize in relation to a receipted ticket which is presented at the Commission's head office until the name and address of at least one person is sufficiently set out to identify a prize winner, in the space provided on the receipted ticket.

(2) Where a receipted ticket under subrule (1) is received by the Commission, and a name and address is not sufficiently set out to —

- (a) establish the prize winner's identity;
- (b) establish either the address or the name to be paid; or
- (c) indicate who of the names and addresses is to be paid,

the Commission may —

- (d) reject a claim in respect of that ticket;
- (e) where multiple names and addresses appear on the ticket, forward the prize to the name and address first appearing; or
- (f) request a statutory declaration containing such information as to the identity of the prize recipient as the Commission may require.

Commission may require a statutory declaration

49. The Commission may require the holder of a receipted ticket to complete a statutory declaration, upon the payment of any Saturday lotto or super 66 prize to that person, stating that the person has not, or is not to that person's knowledge part of a syndicate which has, acted in a manner contrary to the Act or these rules in relation to a receipted ticket.

Publication of names and addresses of prize winners

50. The Commission may publish the name and address of any prize recipient except where the back of the winning receipted ticket is marked to indicate that the name and address on the ticket is not for publication.

Player Registration Service

51. (1) A subscriber may, at any selling point, request a "Player Registration Service" (PRS) number, which may be used to identify a receipted ticket as being held by the subscriber.

(2) The Commission must issue the PRS number upon receipt of the subscriber's name and address, and the requisite amount of \$2.50, and that PRS number is valid for the 2 years following the date of issue.

(3) Notwithstanding these rules, where a receipted ticket is endorsed with a PRS number, and the holder of that receipted ticket has won a Saturday lotto prize or super 66 prize, the Commission must —

- (a) pay that prize upon presentation of the ticket in the manner set out in these rules, for the allowed period after the relevant draw; or
- (b) forward the prize to the subscriber's address in the form of a cheque, if the prize is not claimed under paragraph (a), following the allowed period.

(4) For the purposes of subrule (3), the "allowed period" is 5 weeks.

(5) The payment by the Commission of any prize payable in respect of a receipted ticket bearing a PRS number to the subscriber whose name corresponds to that PRS number, discharges the Commission from any further obligation in relation to that prize, despite any conflicting information that the Commission may have received in relation to the prize on that receipted ticket.

Instructions

52. (1) The subscriber and any other person claiming a prize in respect of a receipted ticket should follow the instructions on any entry coupon used, and on the back of the receipted ticket.

(2) In the event of any inconsistency arising between the instructions on an entry coupon or receipted ticket and these rules, these rules prevail to the extent of the inconsistency.

Rules to be made available

53. (1) A copy of these rules must be kept at every selling point and must be made available for public inspection upon request.

(2) In addition to the requirement in subrule (1), the Commission may publicize the rules, or any amendment to the rules, in any other manner that it thinks fit.

Decisions of Commission final

54. A decision or determination of the Commission in relation to a Saturday lotto draw or a super 66 draw, and the declaration and payment of prizes under these rules is final and binding upon the holders of receipted tickets and any other persons claiming prizes in respect of the Saturday lotto draw or super 66 draw.

PART 8 — REPEAL AND TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Repeal

55. The *Lotto Rules 1990* are repealed.

Transitional

56. Despite rule 55, the *Lotto Rules 1990* are continued to the extent necessary to ensure payment of prizes for all lotto draws and super 66 draws that took place on or before 18 November 1995.
