LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (ELECTIONS — OWNERS AND OCCUPIERS ROLL) REGULATIONS 1996

Made by His Excellency the Governor in Executive Council.

Citation

1. These regulations may be cited as the Local Government (Elections — Owners and Occupiers Roll) Regulations 1996.

Forms

2. In these regulations a reference to a Form followed by a designation is a reference to the form so designated in Schedule 1.

Nomination of co-owners or co-occupiers - s. 4.31

- 3. (1) A nomination under section 4.31 (1) (e), (f) or (g) of the Act is to be made in writing and
 - in the case of a nomination by a body corporate, be signed by an officer of the body corporate; or
 - (b) in any other case, be signed by all or a majority of the owners or occupiers of the property.
- (2) A nomination for the purposes of section 4.31 (1) of the Act remains in force until $\overline{}$
 - if the nomination is expressed to be for a limited period, the end of that period;
 - an enrolment eligibility claim made by the nominee expires or is rejected;
 - (c) the CEO is notified in writing that the body corporate has, or all or a majority of the owners or occupiers of the property have, cancelled the nomination; or
 - (d) the nominee ceases to be eligible to be nominated.

Enrolment eligibility claim — s. 4.32 (1)

4. An enrolment eligibility claim under section 4.32 (1) of the Act is to be made in the form of Form 1.

Register — s. 4.32 (6)

5. The register referred to in section 4.32 (6) of the Act is to be kept in the form and manner determined by the CEO.

Notice of acceptance or rejection of enrolment eligibility claim — s. 4.32 (6)

- 6. A notice given under section 4.32 (6) of the Act is to be
 - (a) if the enrolment eligibility claim is accepted, in the form of Form 2; or
 - (b) if the enrolment eligibility claim is rejected, in the form of Form 3.

Appeal to Electoral Commissioner — s. 4.32 (8) and 4.35 (4)

7. An appeal under section 4.32 (8) or 4.35 (4) of the Act is to be made in the form and manner determined by the Electoral Commissioner.

Confidentiality

8. Details of a person's date of birth and telephone number provided in an enrolment eligibility claim are confidential and the CEO, and any person to whom that information is disclosed in accordance with this regulation, must ensure that those details are not used or disclosed to any person other than for the purpose of preparing electoral rolls for the relevant district or ward or as otherwise required or permitted by law.

Delivery of documents

- 9. (1) Where a person is required by these regulations to give a document to another person the document may be delivered, posted, faxed or sent by any other electronic means (so long as it is capable of being printed in its entirety, including a signature) to that other person.
- (2) If a document is faxed it is taken to have been received when the fax machine of the person to whom it was sent generates a paper copy of the document.
- (3) If a document is sent by other electronic means it is taken to have been received when the person to whom it was sent causes a paper copy of the document to be generated.

Retention of documents

- A local government must keep
 - (a) an enrolment eligibility claim form
 - if the claim is accepted, for 2 years after the claim expires;
 or
 - (ii) if the claim is rejected, for 2 years after it is rejected;
 - a copy of a notice of acceptance for 2 years after the enrolment eligibility claim to which it relates expires; and
 - (c) a copy of a notice of rejection for 2 years after the claim was rejected.
