An Act to amend the Mandatory Testing (Infectious Diseases)

Act 2014 in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

[Assented to 21 May 2020]

The Parliament of Western Australia enacts as follows:

1. **Short title**

This is the *Mandatory Testing (Infectious Diseases) Amendment* (COVID-19 Response) Act 2020.

2. Commencement

This Act comes into operation as follows —

- sections 1 and 2 on the day on which this Act receives the Royal Assent;
- the rest of the Act on the day after that day. (b)

3. Act amended

This Act amends the *Mandatory Testing (Infectious Diseases)* Act 2014.

4. Section 3 amended

(b) in relation to the taking of a sample of a particular type — a person, or class of persons, prescribed for the taking of that type of sample;

sample means a sample of blood, saliva, mucus, respiratory secretions or other material taken from a person;

6. Section 7 amended

In section 7(1) in the definition of *disease test approval* delete "blood".

7. Section 10 amended
