

TEACHER EDUCATION.

No. 21 of 1974.

AN ACT to amend the Teacher Education Act, 1972.

[Assented to 17th October, 1974.]

BE it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and the Legislative Assembly of Western Australia, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *Teacher Education Act Amendment Act, 1974*.

(2) In this Act the Teacher Education Act, 1972 is referred to as the principal Act.

(3) The principal Act as amended by this Act may be cited as the Teacher Education Act, 1972-1974.

2. Section 3 of the principal Act is amended by deleting the word "Academic", in line eleven.

Section 10

(Constitution of
the Council.)

3. Section 10 of the principal Act is amended by substituting for paragraph (d) a paragraph as follows—

(d) four persons appointed by the Minister from teachers, two of whom shall be engaged in teaching in schools, and two of whom shall be members of and nominated by The State School Teachers' Union of Western Australia (Incorporated) but not necessarily engaged in teaching in schools; .

4. The heading immediately preceding section 55 of the principal Act is amended by deleting the word "Academic".

(Establishment and
maintenance.)

5. Section 55 of the principal Act is repealed and re-enacted as follows—

55. For the purposes of this Act there may be established and maintained in the constituent colleges—

- (a) an organised association of academic staff which may have a branch in each college;
- (b) an organised association of other salaried staff which may have a branch in each college;
- (c) an organised association of enrolled students of the colleges which may have a branch in each college,

and those associations shall be the recognised means of communication and negotiation between academic staff, other salaried staff,

and enrolled students, respectively, and the Council, and those branches shall be the recognised means of communication and negotiation between academic staff, other salaried staff, and enrolled students, respectively, and their respective Boards, but for those purposes there shall not be at the same time more than one such association of academic staff, one such association of other salaried staff, and one such association of enrolled students. .

6. Section 72 of the principal Act is amended by adding after the word "otherwise", being the last word in the section the passage " , but where any money standing to the credit of the college account is not immediately required for those objects, the Board may invest it in any investments authorised by law as those in which trust funds may be invested".
