PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir JAMES STIRLING,  
Knt., Governor and Commander-in-Chief  
of the Colony of Western Australia and  
its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the  
same.

**W**HEREAS, by the third Section of the Act of Council passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty King William the Fourth, No. 4, intituled "An Act to extend the Jurisdiction and regulate the Proceedings of the Court of Quarter Sessions," it is enacted, "that the Sessions of the said Court shall be held at such times and places as the GOVERNOR shall from time to time appoint by proclamation;" and whereas it is expedient that a Session of the said Court should be held in the District of Albany, at King George's Sound:—NOW, THEREFORE, I, the GOVERNOR, do hereby, by this my Proclamation, pursuant to the provisions of the said Enactment, direct and appoint that a Session of the said Court shall be held at Albany, aforesaid, on the first day of May next, or so soon thereafter as may be convenient after the arrival of His Majesty's Colonial Schooner *Champion* at King George's Sound. And notice is hereby also given, that the Civil Court of Western Australia will hold a Session at the same place, for the transaction of all Business within its Jurisdiction, as soon as the Business of the Criminal Court shall have been disposed of.
