PURSUANT to the terms proposed in Lord Glenelg's Despatch, dated the 7th March last, (published in the *Government Gazette* on the 2d September, instant), for the surrender of Lands, whether for the purpose of obtaining full Titles, or with the view of purchasing other portions of Land, applications will be received, until further Notice, at the Office of the Colonial Secretary, in a certain Form, which Applicants may obtain at the Office of the Government Printer.

The Public is requested to observe, that the surrender of only one portion of any one Grant will be accepted, and that the new Boundaries which may be proposed as the separating limit between the part to be retained and the part to be resigned, must be parallel to either the side or back Boundaries of the original Grant; it being necessary, for the purpose of avoiding expensive Surveys, as well as for securing clear Titles, that the right of accepting or refusing the proposals of Applicants in regard to Boundaries, should be reserved to the Government.
