**H**IS Excellency the Governor has been pleased to direct the undermentioned Regulations in regard to the despatch of the Post-Office Mails, and the delivery of Letters, to be published for general information:—

The Post-Offices are open from 10 o'Clock in the morning until 4 in the afternoon every day except Sunday.

The Mail from Perth to Fremantle closes at 2 o'Clock every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and is despatched immediately afterwards.

The Mail from Perth to Guildford closes at 3 o'Clock on Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday, and is despatched immediately afterwards.

The Mail from Fremantle to Perth closes at 2 o'Clock every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday, and is despatched immediately afterwards.

The Mail from Guildford to Perth closes at 8 o'Clock in the morning on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Saturdays, and is despatched immediately afterwards.

All Letters received by mail at the Post-Offices of Perth or Fremantle for residents in either of those places, will be delivered at such residents' houses, within the streets of the town,—one penny being charged in addition to the regular postage.

All Notes or Letters put into the Post Office of Perth for residents in that town, will be delivered at their respective houses, within the streets of the town, at the charge of one penny; and a similar delivery, subject to the same charge, will be made at Fremantle.

Letters for persons residing in York will be forwarded from the Guildford Post-Office once every fourteen days.
