*A Bill to constitute the Island of Rottnest
a Public Prison.*

Preamble.—Whereas it has been deemed expedient to provide some place within the limits of the Colony of Western Australia in which such of the Aboriginal Race as are sentenced to transportation or imprisonment, or committed for trial, may be conveniently kept, in order that they may be instructed in useful knowledge, and gradually trained in the habits of civilized life;—

It is proposed—

1st. To constitute the Island of Rottnest one of the Public Prisons of this Colony.

2d. That the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, should be empowered to alter and define the limits of the Prison by Proclamation from time to time, if it should be deemed expedient; and also to make all such precautionary rules and regulations touching the places and times and manner of landing of Boats as may be necessary to prevent the escape of the Prisoners. Any person wilfully contravening any these Regulations to be subject to a penalty.

3d. The Governor, with advice and consent of Executive Council, empowered to appoint Gaoler, or other requisite Officers, and to make rules and regulations, to ensure the custody and discipline, as well as the health and comfort, of the Prisoners.

4th. Act not to prevent the Island from being used for confinement of other than Native Prisoners.
