FROM information recently received, their being every reason to believe that the two natives, *Hegan* and *Derup* or *Durrup*, for whose apprehension a reward was offered, in a notice dated 25th February last, were not concerned in the murder of Mrs. Cook,—but, that two natives, called *Yambup* and *Boonjangwit*, were so concerned,—notice is hereby given that the offer of a reward for the apprehension of the said *Hegan* and *Derup* or *Durrup*, is now withdrawn; and, that a reward of £5 will be given to any European or Europeans who will apprehend and lodge the said *Yambup* or *Boonjangwit*, in Perth or Fremantle jail: and, to any natives who shall give such information or assistance as may lead to the apprehension of either of the two last named natives, ten pounds weight of flour.

ALIGNMENT OF STREETS.

IT being the intention of His Excellency the Governor, to introduce to the Legislative Council, as early as may be found practicable, a bill for the better alignment of the streets, in the several towns in this Colony, which, from various causes, are found to deviate in some instances, from the limits and direction which should have been preserved, with reference to the true boundaries of the respective allotments;—and the efficiency of such a bill depending principally upon surveys which cannot be completed before the expiration of the present winter, His Excellency is pleased to direct this notice of his intention to be given, in order to prevent the inconvenience that would be likely to result from individuals building nearer to the present streets than the several distances enjoined by the existing town regulations; as in framing the proposed bill, these regulations will be adhered to as closely as may be found convenient.
