Fremantle, Nov. 30, 1840.

SIR,—In reply to your letter of the 27th inst., in regard to the mail which was lost alongside the Shepherd, I beg to inform you for the information of the Governor, that it was addressed to the Postmaster, Swan River, and in size as if it contained a newspaper or two, or three or four letters. In handing it down from the ship it was blown overboard by a sudden gust of wind. A boat was immediately sent in search of it, but in consequence of the heavy swell and high wind, it was never afterwards seen.
