## Proclamation.

*By His Excellency JOHN HUTT, Esquire, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony of Western Australia and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same.*

WHEREAS, by an Act of the Local Legislature passed in the 4th & 5th years of the reign of Her Majesty Queen Victoria, No. 18, entitled "An Act to provide for the improvement of Towns in the Colony of Western Australia," the Governor is empowered to establish by proclamation all Tolls, Rates, Dues, or Charges which may hereafter be made payable at or by means of the use of any lines or modes of communication within any town of the said Colony; And whereas the Road Trustees have made a Causeway across the Flats in and over the Swan River, and have recommended that the following scale of charges and tolls shall be made payable thereat;— Now, therefore, I, the Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the authority given to me in and by the said recited Act, do hereby establish the following tolls and charges, and do order that the same shall and may be demanded and paid at and for the use of the said Causeway, viz:—

For every foot passenger....	0	1
“ Sheep, lamb, pig, or goat .....	0	1
“ head of neat cattle	0	3
“ Horse, ass, or mule	0	3
“ Gig, chaise, cart, dray, or other vehicle, drawn by one horse or other animal.....	0	6
And for every additional animal.....	0	6

Between sunset and sunrise the tolls to be one-half additional.

Except, nevertheless, all Her Majesty's officers and soldiers, being in proper staff or regimental or military uniform, dress or undress, and their horses, (but not when passing in any private or hired vehicle), and all recruits marching by route, and all

carriages and horses belonging to Her Majesty, or employed in Her service under the provisions of the Mutiny Act, when conveying persons or baggage, or returning therefrom; and all mail carriers when actually engaged in their duty, who are respectively to be exempted from any charge or toll whatsoever.
