**SALE OF AN OCCUPATION LI-
CENSE.**

The Collector of Revenue will put up to auction at the Public Offices at 1 o'clock, on Wednesday, the 6th of December next, a license to occupy for one year from the 1st day of January next, the following portion of land in the neighborhood of Fremantle:—

One hundred acres situated as follows: bounded on the north by a line 33 chains 33 links in width, commencing at the N.E. angle of Mr. MacDermott's location, and running east along south boundary of Fremantle townsite; thence by a due south line 30 chains in length to S.E. angle; thence due west 33 chains 33 links to west boundary; and thence due north 30 chains to original starting point, to form west boundary.

The wheat to be subject to the approval of a Board of Survey before payment is made.

No tender will be received for a less quantity than (100) one hundred bushels;

and the parties whose tenders are accepted will be required to enter into a bond with two good sureties for the due performance of their contract.

Payment for these supplies will be made by Bills at thirty days sight on the Right Honorable the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, payable in London *at par*.
